change National Child Measurement Programme

The National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) measures the height and weight of children in EYFS (aged 4 to 5) and in Year 6 (aged 10 to 11), to assess overweight and obesity levels in children within primary schools. The programme was set up in line with the government's strategy to tackle obesity. Heights and weights are measured and used to calculate a Body Mass Index (BMI) centile. The measurement process is overseen by trained healthcare professionals in schools.

Absences from school
